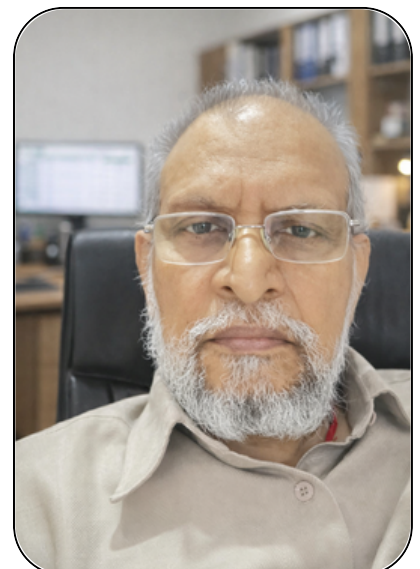

Through livelihood programs, vocational and computer training improve employability, advancing SDG 1 and 8. Community and rural initiatives such as awareness meetings and cleanliness drives align with SDG 11 and 13. Social and digital inclusion activities further strengthen participation and partnerships under SDG 16 and 17, promoting sustainable community empowerment.

Our growing presence across Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, and **Andhra Pradesh**

reflects our dedication to reaching communities that need support the most.

Each location we serve strengthens our mission to reduce inequality and create equal opportunities.



Aarohan places strong emphasis on creating a safe, caring, and inclusive learning environment for marginalized and vulnerable children, particularly those in the 2.5-5 years age group. Classrooms are designed as child-friendly spaces where children feel secure, engaged, and motivated to learn. Regular monitoring of hygiene, seating arrangements, ventilation, and overall cleanliness is ensured to provide a healthy and comfortable learning atmosphere.

The ECCD program, initiated in 2015 with the belief “Happy childhood creates Healthy adulthood,” began in Malviya Nagar, South Delhi, focusing on children of daily wage workers lacking safety, emotional support, and early learning opportunities. Currently, Aarohan operates 3 ECCD centers, reaching 135+ children from vulnerable communities, ensuring their care and holistic development.

During the year, children accessed safe, child-friendly learning spaces. play-based learning sessions were conducted, strengthening foundational skills. Children showed improvement in communication and confidence.

The program conducted 36 parent meetings, achieving 80% participation and improving home support. Additionally, 75% children were prepared for school readiness and transition.

Creative learning was promoted through over 200 activity sessions, along with more than 4 community and health awareness activities, benefiting all enrolled children.

Aligned with the theme of Quality Education, Aarohan implements structured educational programs with the mission “No Child is Left Behind.” from Grade 1 to Grade 12, with a special focus on marginalized and socially excluded communities, including manual scavenger families, rag-picker communities, tribal groups, and other vulnerable children who are out of school, irregular in attendance, or academically weak due to limited educational support at home or in their communities.

### Four Tier Program Structure

#### 1. PASS Program (Primary Academic Support for Students) -

Grades 1 to 5. This program focuses on basic literacy, numeracy, reading, writing, and primarily supports first-generation learners from marginalized communities such as manual scavenger and rag-picker families, building a strong academic foundation while improving confidence and discipline.

**2. PATHWAYS Program** - Grades 6 to 8. Acts as a bridge program for middle-school students with an emphasis on subject clarity, conceptual learning, digital exposure, and readiness for the higher classes. It is especially designed to prevent dropouts among migrant children and children from the last section of society in formal education.

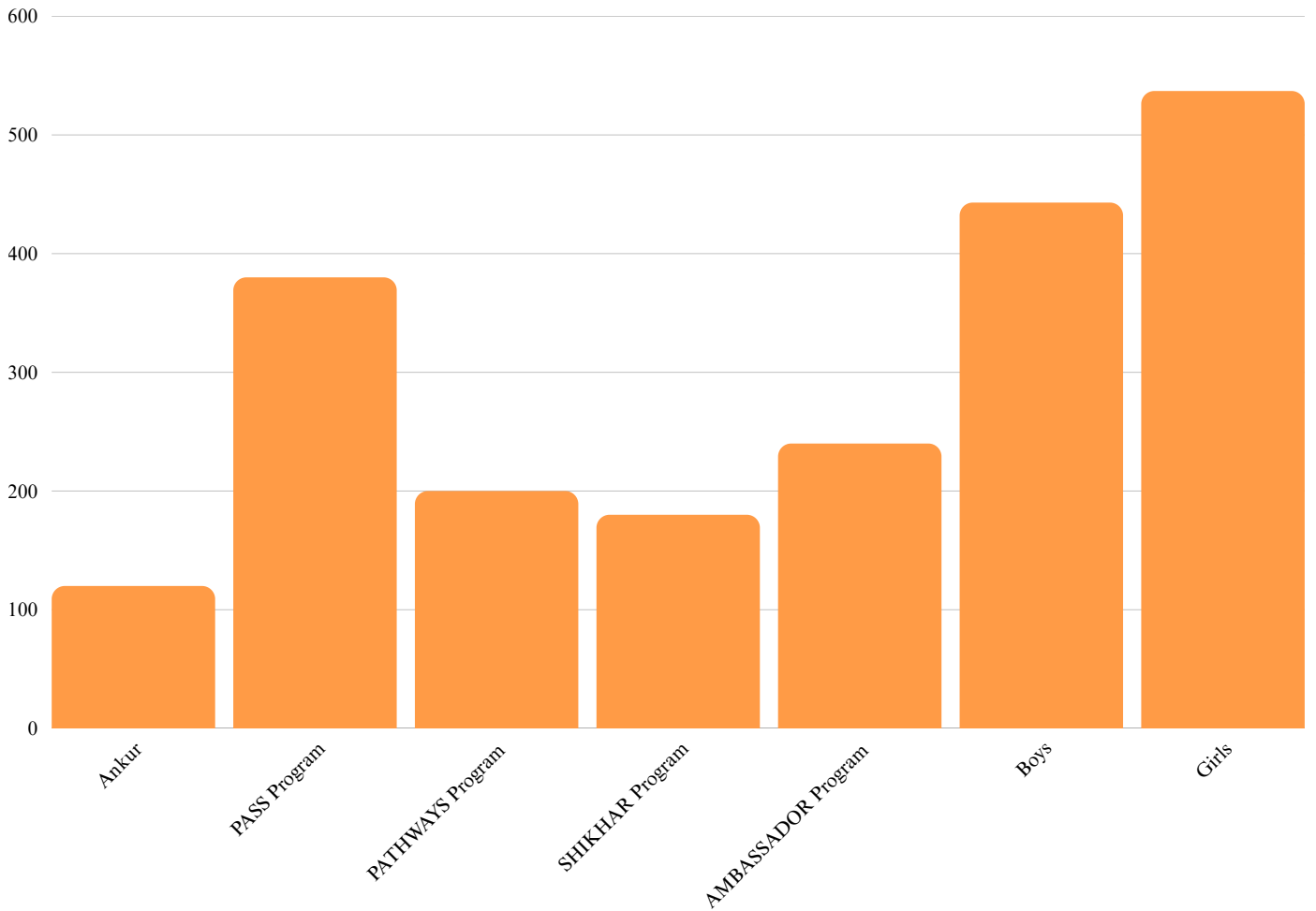
**3. SHIKHAR Program** - Grades 9 to 10. Provides academic mentoring, exam preparation, personality development, and career orientation. The program guides adolescents from socially excluded and low-income backgrounds to set clear academic and career goals.

**4. AMBASSADOR Program** - Grades 11 to 12. Focuses on leadership development, career readiness, and higher-education guidance. Students from underprivileged and marginalized communities are encouraged to become peer mentors and community role models, creating positive influence among younger learners.

Across all programs, Aarohan promotes academic improvement, emotional well-being, discipline, leadership, and social responsibility. Regular parent engagement, community outreach, and structured monitoring systems ensure continuous guidance and inclusive support for children belonging to manual scavenger, rag-picker, tribal, and other disadvantaged communities.

Through these integrated initiatives, Aarohan has supported a significant number of marginalized children across project locations.

Feed with Dignity is not merely a slogan for Aarohan it is a sustained commitment to safeguarding every child's right to adequate nutrition and healthy development. As malnutrition directly impacts cognitive growth, school attendance, and overall well-being, Aarohan has embedded structured meal support within its child welfare initiatives.

During the year, Aarohan provided nutritious, balanced meals to 735 children across multiple project locations. Each meal was carefully planned to include essential nutrients required for physical growth, improved immunity, and enhanced concentration in learning environments.

Beyond addressing hunger, the initiative fosters dignity, equality, and inclusion, ensuring that children from vulnerable backgrounds receive meals in a safe and respectful setting. By integrating nutrition support with education and community engagement, Aarohan strengthens both immediate health outcomes and long-term academic performance.

Feed with Dignity reflects Aarohan's holistic approach: combating malnutrition, promoting child welfare, and building a healthier, more empowered generation.

Health is a core pillar of Aarohan's child development approach, ensuring that every child has access to essential preventive healthcare services. Understanding that untreated health issues can significantly hinder learning outcomes, attendance, and overall well-being, Aarohan integrates structured health check-ups within its education and welfare programs. During the year, Aarohan organized regular health screening camps for students across multiple project locations. These check-ups included basic physical examinations, height and weight monitoring, vision screening, and general health assessments conducted by qualified medical professionals. Early identification of nutritional deficiencies, minor ailments, and other health concerns enabled timely intervention and referral support where required.

The initiative not only promotes physical well-being but also strengthens awareness about hygiene, sanitation, and healthy lifestyle practices among children and their families. Through this sustained effort, Aarohan reinforces its commitment to nurturing healthy, confident, and school-ready children, ensuring that health challenges do not become barriers to education and holistic development.





Aarohan has launched STEM Labs at two project locations, strengthening experiential learning for children from marginalized communities. These labs act as innovation hubs where students learn beyond textbooks through activity-based approaches. By integrating Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM), Aarohan promotes critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving skills. Students engage in hands-on experiments, logical reasoning, and model-based learning, making education more interactive and meaningful.



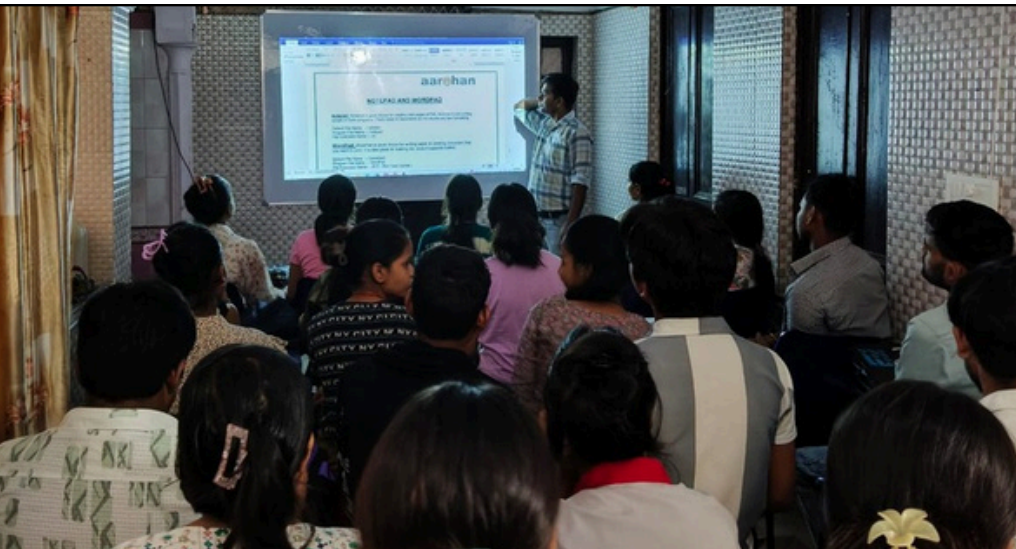
### CENTERS FOR EXCELLENCE

Aarohan operated two Centers for Excellence across different locations to equip children and adolescents with essential 21st-century skills and improve future employability. Total of 226 children were enrolled during the reporting period.

The Centers functioned as structured learning hubs offering academic support, digital literacy, life skills training, and career exposure. **Key Interventions**

- Digital Literacy: Basic computer education, internet use,
- Communication & Soft Skills: Public speaking, confidence, teamwork, and leadership.
- Career Guidance: Information on higher education, vocational & emerging careers option.
- Life Skills: Critical thinking, problem-solving, financial literacy, and decision-making.

The initiative strengthened students' digital skills, academic confidence, and career awareness. Participants showed improved engagement, communication abilities, and clearer aspirations for higher education and employment. Through these Centers, Aarohan continues to reduce educational gaps and prepare children from underserved communities for a competitive future.





Aarohan's Women Livelihood and Skill Development Program aims to create sustainable income opportunities by training women in tailoring and fashion designing. The initiative strengthens practical skills, confidence, and financial independence, enabling women to pursue home-based work or local employment. During the year, more than 160 women benefited from the training, with many beginning small income-generating activities. The program promotes self-reliance, decision-making power, and community participation, transforming skills into dignity, resilience, and long-term social impact for women and their families.

### Highlights

- 160+ women trained in tailoring and fashion designing
- 120+ women initiated home-based or local employment activities
- 100+ women reported improved confidence and financial independence
- 90+ women strengthened self-reliance and decision-making skills
- 75+ women engaged in leadership or community roles
- 110+ women converted skills into regular income opportunities

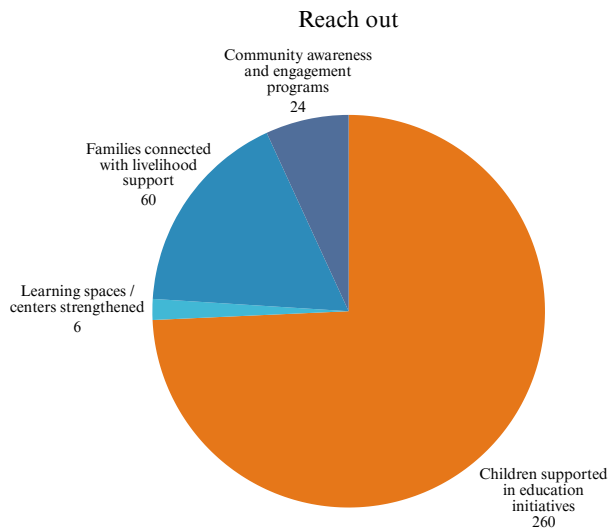

Aarohan is closely working with tribal communities in Araku Valley, Visakhapatnam District, Andhra Pradesh, and Kalahandi District, Odisha, to improve children’s access to quality education and strengthen livelihood opportunities for family members. The initiative emphasizes the creation of safe and supportive learning environments, improvement of basic educational infrastructure, and promotion of family-based skill development through continuous community engagement and local partnerships, ensuring sustainable and inclusive growth.

Through its consistent presence in these remote and underserved tribal regions, Aarohan is able to extend holistic educational support, awareness on health and social rights, and long-term socio-economic empowerment to marginalized and secluded communities. These efforts not only enhance school participation and skill development but also foster dignity, confidence, and resilience among children and families, paving the way for improved living standards and brighter future opportunities.

Aarohan strengthened its commitment to gender inclusion by reaching 80+ transgender individuals through livelihood training, health awareness, and social integration initiatives. Safe learning spaces, vocational skills, and income opportunities were supported through regular mentorship and capacity-building. These efforts built dignity, confidence, community acceptance, and self-reliance, reinforcing Aarohan's vision of equal opportunity and sustainable growth for all.

### Highlights

- 80+ transgender individuals directly reached and engaged
- 200 Vocational and livelihood skills delivered through structured trainings
- 12 Health awareness and social integration sessions were conducted
- Safe and inclusive learning spaces established/facilitated

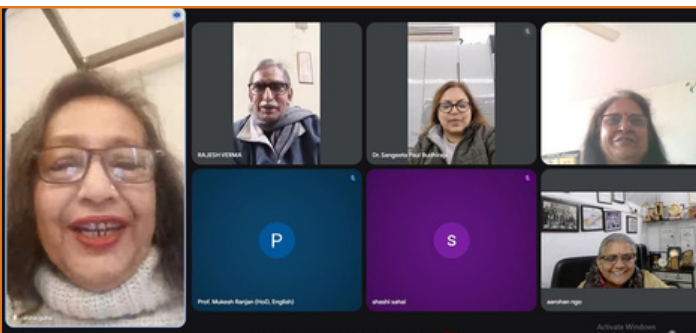

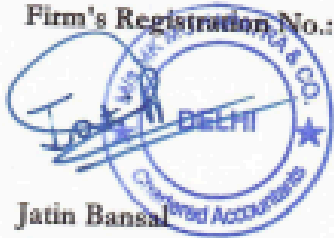
